That's a wrap on the shafts

Our Jansen team celebrated the successful completion of the US\$2.97B mine shaft project. The liners in both production and service shafts were completed in June 2022, bringing the N3SR (New Service Shaft and Site Readiness) project to an end.

This project team oversaw the excavation and lining of the shafts, along with the installation of utilities and essential surface infrastructure. Thyssen-Redpath-Ledcor (TRL) was the joint venture entrusted to complete the project's final shaft lining.

"The team's safety record and performance since January 2020 has exceeded our plan," said Simon Thomas, President Potash. "Our approach to safety, work planning discipline and continuous improvement – along with our collaborative and integrated team approach – really shone in the final stages of this project."

The next steps for the team are the shaft and underground mining scopes under Jansen Stage 1 (JS1). Building off the lessons learned and the gained momentum from the sinking and lining phase, we are targeting JS1 to achieve better safety performance and work planning discipline success.

Approximately US\$740 million in capital expenditure is planned for work at Jansen Stage 1 between 2022 June to 2023 July, which will continue to focus on civil and mechanical construction on the surface and underground, as well as equipment procurement and port construction.

BHP launches the Future is Clear campaign in Canada

People Profile - Hareem Shafi, Graduate Engineer

Recently we caught up with Hareem Shafi, Graduate Engineer; she's been at BHP for over a year and a half. As a newer member of BHP's growing team, we wanted to learn more about Hareem's job and the benefits of being a woman in the mining industry.

Q: Describe your job at BHP?

A: I am an engineer by profession, and as part of BHP's graduate program, I have gotten to work with different teams to experience different aspects of the business. I worked with the project engineering team on site at Jansen to support construction of the shaft liner; I worked with the underground production systems team for solutions engineering of the underground proximity detection system, and I also got to work with the study team for Jansen stage 2.

Q: As a woman, what made you seek a role in mining?

A: I chose a career in mining because I find it fascinating how humans have been employing science to extract the resources from the earth that we need to build and support our civilizations, and I find it fulfilling to be able to contribute to that.

Q: How do you see the mining industry benefiting from more women in mining?

A: Apart from the fundamental value of equality, mining as a field can see tangible results from the diversity of lived experiences and unique perspectives that more gender equality in the workforce would bring. Various studies have shown improved innovation, costeffectiveness, safety, and strategic resilience.

Q: What would you say to other women who are considering switching into a mining related job?

A: I am a strong believer that a career in mining is not only financially empowering to women, but it can also be very fulfilling. Saskatchewan is a resource rich province, and the mining industry is a key contributor to the economy, and the possibilities and opportunities for women to contribute and grow are many.

Diverse teams at BHP are safer, more productive and have a better culture. If you're a woman considering a job in the mining industry, BHP, in partnership with Women Building Futures, is offering Trades Readiness training this winter. The program provides women with the knowledge, safety certificates, hands-on skills and best practices for working in construction, which are required to start a successful career in the mining industry. This program will be delivered in Saskatoon, SK, and will provide a minimum wage to attendees to support living expenses during training.
